


Acceptable Materials for Recycling




PLASTICS

#1 & #2 beverage bottles or any clean, rigid, plastic bottles with a neck smaller than its body. These items are typically closed with a screw top, snap cap, or other closure. Remove these lids & rinse clean for proper disposal.



CANS

Includes aluminum cans, tin cans, and food containers. Steel beverage cans and food containers are also included in this material category. All items must be CLEAN OF FOOD. Paint and aerosol cans are NOT allowed.



CARDBOARD

Includes corrugated cardboard, shipping/moving boxes, cereal & dry food boxes, shoe & tissue boxes, beverage/food cartons, and paper towel/tissue rolls. All boxes MUST BE IN THE CART for collection and FLATTENED to save space. NO PIZZA BOXES.



PAPER

Includes newspapers, magazines, brochures, paper back books, letterhead, envelopes without the plastic window, notebook paper (no backings), computer paper, paper bags, folders, phone books, greeting cards, regular/junk mail, cereal & shoe boxes.



GLASS

Includes glass food/beverage containers, bottles, and jars. Lids must be removed and separated before being disposed of. ALL LIQUID AND FOOD WASTE MUST BE REMOVED BEFORE BEING RECYCLED.



NOT ACCEPTED

STYROFOAM, Window glass & mirrors, electronic waste (TVs & computers), clothing, motor oil & chemical containers, yard waste, shredded paper, plastic bags, ceramics/dishes, food waste, scrap metal, monitors, needles, medical waste, propane tanks, batteries.

All recyclable items need to be LOOSE and not bagged. Bagging these materials in black bags is NOT ACCEPTABLE.
